Formally launched in 2024, this programme aims to encourage reading for pleasure and visiting the library over the six-week summer holiday. School Readiness

Starting school can be both exciting and daunting, for parent and child. School Readiness Bags are available to borrow from libraries and contain three books about starting school. Also included are information and tips for families to prepare their child for this big step. The books are specially chosen and can be read in the weeks prior to school starting. The aim is to allow children time to ask questions, give them the opportunity to express any emotions and to come together as a family, providing reassurance and confidence.

Teacher's Library Card

Suffolk Community Libraries offers opportunities for schools to purchase a Teacher's Library Card. This allows one class teacher to borrow up to 35 books for a longer loan period of 17 weeks. Useful for creating class reading corners, building research skills, or curating a specific unit of work. The cards cost £50 per card per year and schools can purchase up to eight cards. Books can be searched and reserved via our online system and librarians are often able to help recommend books for school staff.

Forest of Stories

Forest of Stories is our reading programme for children aged 0-5. Families can collect their starter pack from any library in Suffolk and begin their daily reading adventure of reading daily with their children. Playgroups, nurseries and schools can get in touch to enquire about using this resource with larger groups of children. Reading rewards at milestones can be collected from any library. Families can read for 100 days in Phase One, and Phase Two leads families on a reading adventure for 300 days.
