Who are we looking for?

This opportunity is ideal for anyone aged 18 – 25 with an interest in gaining experience in the creative industry.

We welcome a range of applicants, and you do not need formal qualifications to apply. You could have no experience, you could be a self-taught creative, or a student in education.

We're particularly motivated to work with individuals who are underrepresented in the sector and/or come from low-income backgrounds.

If you identify with the above and are passionate about music & media, we want to hear from you!

We will be recruiting two cohorts of four to each library location, with the two cohorts meeting throughout the project to share learning and exchange ideas.

Applicants are welcome to attend events at the other cohort's location, though this will be in a voluntary capacity.

We are unable to offer a fee for attending events that you are not contracted to work as part of the project. However, if you're interested in supporting or attending events at the other location, we can cover your travel costs to and from the library.

Duration

Junior Assistant Producer's will be paid to work a total of 12 days on the project between January – June 2026, mainly working on weekdays during half-term and holiday periods, although some working days will happen outside of the holidays. Hours

Your working hours will vary and will cover morning, afternoon and evenings.

Fee

£150 day fee x 12 days = £1800 total.

We completely understand that, if you are just starting out in the world of work, you may not have had the chance to set this up yet. It takes time to learn these things, and we're here to help.

We'll support you through the onboarding process and guide you in setting up the key elements of freelance work, such as registering as self-employed, arranging insurance, and applying for a DBS check, where required.
